Peer Mediators

Our 16 year 5 & 6 Peer Mediators are making such a difference in the playground as they support other students to help themselves to find solutions to their own problems when playing with others. Last week they analysed term 1 data to check out whether our

hunches, such as, "Is it the Year 3 & 4 boys who have the most disagreements when playing games?" and "Do

more incidents occur on Fridays?" They are using this information to help them understand how best to support all students in our school to play with others and enjoy their company.



Classroom Learning Environments

Our classrooms are all about learners understanding how they learn best. Here in Kahurangi you can see that some students enjoy choosing to work on the floor,



others sit at lower tables whilst others prefer a traditional chair and table. Once our new classroom spaces are completed we will start purchase to furniture that supports these different learning styles.

In term 2 our focus school-wide will be to continue developing our Learning Culture initiative. In term 1, Stage 1 "TALKING" was rolled out. You may have heard your child talking about "Think Crews" and 4 Corners .These are some of the strategies being taught to help children work collaboratively in groups and to share/listen to others' ideas. Term 2 introduces Stage 2 which looks at developing "THINKING" skills. Each class will be introduced to the characters Ida Ideas (finds solutions/new ideas/invent/imagine) and Benny Sunshine (looks for good ideas/reasons why things will work/strength in ideas). These will assist learners in developing their creative thinking and problem-solving skills. Students will have opportunities across the curriculum to apply their learning strategies, but in particular through Technology opportunities.

The Maori celebration of Matariki occurs during term 2 and we will be holding a community Celebration of

Learning evening where students can share their learning with their families – keep Friday 22 June FREE!

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What to Do When Your Child is Sick or Away

If your child is unwell and not coming to school, **please notify the Office** before 9am **every day your child is away**. **Telephone** 04 939 0186, **email** office@rewarewa.school.nz or use the automated absence email on our **website** <u>http://www.rewarewa.school.nz/report-an-absence.html</u>

We must hear from a parent/caregiver - do not ask children to notify us or rely on teachers to pass on a message.

Please be aware, if your child has vomiting or diarrhoea, they must be kept away from school for 48 hours following the last episode to avoid infecting others. They will not be able to swim in the school pool for 14 days following the last episode; this is public health policy.
