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

The School Houses programme......

is being overhauled and, starting in Term 2, all the children in the school will be placed into 4 Houses:

Waitohi, Totaranui, Kaipupu and Arapaoa. Over the last two days, interested children from Rooms 1 and 2 have been applying for the roles of House Captains and Support Leaders.

Those who are chosen will be responsible for leading their House as they strive to win the House Shield. They will be mentored and supported to learn to be effective leaders. House points will be earned in House events, with the first of the these to be a whole school sports day on Friday 18 May. Points will also be earned by a new school-wide values reward system. The details of this are still being finalised and will start part-way through the term.

There will be a special Assembly on the first day back next term to tell children which House they are in and introduce the House Captains and Support Leaders.


