# Maungakiekie Kāhui Ako (Community of Learners)

'Rangitāmirotia ngā miro ako tuatinitini.'
Weave together the threads of learning

- → All teachers in the Maungakiekie Kāhui Ako are learning about a teacher efficacy tool called a "SPIRAL OF INQUIRY"

  This tool helps our teachers inquire into their teaching practice to investigate teacher efficacy and evaluate teaching strategies.
- → The SPIRAL OF INQUIRY is being completed by ALL teachers at Stanhope Road School; Sylvia Park School, Ellerslie School, Panmure District School; Bailey Road School; and One Tree Hill College. The investigation of what works, and what does not work in teaching and learning forms the basis for some very collaborative professional dialogue across and within schools
- → The SPIRAL OF INQUIRY evaluation is currently being developed so by the end of the year, we will have some data on the results from teachers' Spiral of Inquiry findings and how successful we have been as a Community of Learners our Kāhui Ako.

We celebrate the work of all our teachers within our Kāhui Ako.

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
