Principal's Voice



Dear Parents/Carers/Community Members

Thanks

It is hard to believe our first term is coming to a close. A special thanks to our community volunteers who have assisted this term with students and teachers. We do appreciate your time and effort. There is no doubt that our children greatly benefit. A special thank you to those who assisted with the Shannon Community Hauora Health Day. If you are in a position to volunteer we would love to hear from you. Assistance in supervising breakfast, fundraising lunches, reading, school gardens, and all suggestions are welcome.

Changes

Unfortunately we have been unable to provide for our Rumakii te reo immersion class this year. Our numbers were down and we are unable to continue to sustain school funding for staffing a full time te reo teacher. However we have been lucky to employ Pa Wylie Te Peeti who is working in the school as a teacher and student support, te reo kaiako and kaumātua.

The remainder of our staffing has remained stable as for last year.

School Fence

The Ministry of Education has funded fencing of the whole school so that any 'runner' students will be unable to abscond from the school grounds. There are still a few teething issues that need to be dealt with, so please be patient. There is a release button at the waharoa (main gateway) to enter the school. The fence is not to keep people out and you are always most welcome to come and visit us.

Kāhui Ako - Community of Learners

I have been appointed as Kāhui Ako Leader for our Kerekere Cluster and work closely with the Leader of the Taitoko Cluster as a Horowhenua Community of Learners. We are still in the early stages of development and hope that through all schools working collaboratively we can make a positive impact on the learning for all Horowhenua students.

Changes in Education

The whole world has changed from when I was at school. We are doing our students a disservice if we continue to teach them to a 19th Century model. The advances and changes in communication, digital technology and robotics already means that people need a different set of skills. Business is already asking for people who can - problem solve, think critically and creatively. We also know that children learn best from authentic contexts and activities which is where children's passions lie. At Shannon School we aim to provide holistic, authentic learning experiences for all of our students in a digital and bicultural setting. You are most welcome to come into the school to view our school environment and discuss our children's learning journeys.

Curriculum

The new government is in the process of removing legislation around reporting against National Standards in literacy and numeracy with a move back to recognising the breadth and richness of our New Zealand curriculum, and for developing children "who will be confident, connected, actively involved, and lifelong learners." There has been no evidence that the experiment to raise student achievement through imposing National Standards has worked. Many of our students after only one year at school were deemed to have failed the Standard, yet we know that many students will achieve at their appropriate age level after two or three years at school.

As part of our Shannon School Curriculum we have a holistic approach to learning. Our aim this year is to involve our children in more out of school experiences (EOTC). We no longer just look at whole class trips but rather at activities that interested groups of children can attend. If you think there is a 'learning opportunity' that a group of children could benefit from please contact us to arrange. If you have a skill or interest (cooking, knitting, flax weaving) also please contact us to work with a small group of children.

SHANNON KIDS' CLUB

We meet once a fortnight in term-time, usually Fridays 5-7pm, at the Anglican Church Hall, Stout St.

Mostly, we run activity sessions, including various sports, games, cooking, art, craft, a "God Spot" and eating. Occasionally we have trips, for example to Levin Aquatic Centre or Centre Skate. Sometimes we have just games sessions, celebrations, talent quests, triathlons, movies, discos and other fun times. The usual cost is a dollar or two.

We are open to all primary school aged children and sometimes run sessions suitable for preschool children.

We encourage parents, carers and other whanau and family members to participate in the sessions if they wish to. We have a dedicated group of voluntary leaders and are always seeking volunteers and other types of support, so if you are interested please ring me. We are currently seeking a few more adult volunteer leaders, some youth assist at the sessions and develop their leadership skills.

Children need to be registered to attend sessions; this can be done in advance or at the hall by a parent or carer. All children need to be either collected by an adult or given a lift home at the end of the session; when on trips all children are dropped off home or at an address specified by their carer.
