Families need to be aware that school photos are scheduled for next Tuesday 8th May. We ask that you ensure all students have correct, clean, tidy winter uniform for the photos. This includes Year 11-13 students ensuring they have a tie. Family photos will be taken at morning interval. To book a family photo, please phone the school office prior to Tuesday. With winter uniform in mind, it is a good opportunity to remind families about the school expectations. For Year 7-13 students the expectation is fully black or brown shoes (not high tops) and the associated shorts, trousers, kilt, shirt and blouses. Where we get the most issues is around the wearing of non-uniform jackets and jerseys. We do have some leniency around allowing students to wear puffer jackets and waterproof jackets while coming to school but when at school these items should not be worn and should not be a substitute for uniform items, eg wearing a puffer jacket instead of the polar fleece. Also for Year 1-6 students, the expectation is also the same and we should not see hoodies, Hawarden Netball and Hurunui Rugby jerseys. Students must wear a plain navy blue jersey (not a hoodie) and/or a plain navy blue

or school polar fleece. We ask that all families work hard to support us by ensuring students leave home wearing the correct uniform.

As always, it looks to be a very busy term ahead. Area Schools' Sports trials are being held this Sunday and Monday at Amuri Area School; Year 7 and 8 debating starts next Tuesday and the Careers Expo for Year 11-13 students is next Thursday. Also, the Exploring Community will be eagerly preparing for their camp at Wainui out on Banks Peninsula in Week Three of this
