## eLearning @ Rewa Rewa School

We have a year 6 group being project lead to develop advanced coding skills, which will enable them to create their own webpages. This week another group of students is working with a parent to develop basic coding skills. ## Board of Trustees News

We have 99 students with our 100th child arriving next week which is very exciting, as last year we didn't reach this number until the end of term 4 . Our two job-share teachers will begin undertaking fulltime hours as from the start of term 3 for the rest of the year.

Following NZSTA guidelines, the Board advertised its recent vacancy and has now selected a candidate. We are thrilled to announce that Ambresh Kapoor (dad to Eddy, Esha and Eashan), will join us. It is wonderful to have someone who can bring his experience to the table and also be a voice to represent the growing number of Asian and Indian families who are choosing to belong to our school community. Just out of interest, here are our current stats re. ethnic groups at Rewa Rewa School.

We have 15 ethnic groups of whom Maori ( 28 students) and European ( 26 students) form the largest groups. These are followed by Indian (11 students, Chinese (8 students), Filipino ( 6 students), Samoan ( 5 students), as well as 1-4 students from each of the following groups: Malay (3), Tokelauan, Fijian, Japanese, South Korean, Croatian, Chilean, British and Pakistani.
We have spoken to some of our international families and there is interest among these families to meet at school one evening to look at how our school might best serve them. Watch out for an invitation in the next few weeks. We firmly believe that by celebrating our diversity, we will ALL be the richer for it.

## Solar Power Panels

Our solar panels were installed during the holidays and are now generating power for the school. We are conducting tests to see how much it actually costs us to heat the pool and we will be sharing data with classes as we start to reduce our electricity power usage. Our huge thanks to Electrotech 2011 Ltd for installing the panels, Al, our Caretaker, for initiating this project, parents Chris Turnbull and Naomi Godfrey, as well as Johnsonville Pub Charities and Hutt Mana Trust for their very generous community sponsorship.

Life Education Trust Programme
 Harold and the Life Education Trust van visited us last week to deliver the Life Education programme about Friendships and Self-Management skills. This is an extremely valuable programme that supports our Health Programme and makes learning memorable. The cost for these lessons comes from each child's activity fee, so this is a timely reminder to ask those parents who have yet to settle their accounts, to please do so as soon as possible thank you.

Other payments we have also made this term include Easyswim subsidised lessons, Hapara \& Seesaw Blog fees (connecting home and school through IT), and additional resources, such as reading kits for the PTP programme.
