I spent a fabulous day at the Area School Sports Trials at Amuri Area School on Monday. It was a great opportunity to be part of the coming together of students from the 13 Area Schools that constitute the Top of the South Island. The area stretches as far as Collingwood to the north, Karamea to the west, South Westland to the south and Akaroa to the east. The Top of the South Island Area Schools span a massive geographical area and provides opportunities for students in mostly rural schools and in some of the most isolated reaches of the country. In some of these schools, it is difficult for students to be able to play sport in a competitive schoolbased context. Area Schools' sports provides a great opportunity for students from the furthest reaches of our country to come together on the sports field and to form friendships that they will take with them far past their time at school. Well done to all our students who trialled on Monday and congratulations to those that have been selected into teams to play at the National Sports Tournament in Christchurch over 9th to 12th July.

Last night we ran our second Whanau Hui for the year. Thank you so much to those that came together to discuss activities and opportunities that we will be running in the school this year. The major point of discussion was around our planned Matariki celebrations later in the term. Matariki is the Māori name for the cluster of stars also known as the Pleiades. It rises in mid-winter and traditionally for Māori and many other pacific cultures, it heralds the start of a new year. Matariki literally means the 'eyes of god' (mata ariki) or 'little eyes' (mata riki). According to myth, when Ranginui, the sky father, and Papatūānuku, the earth mother, were separated by their children, the god of the winds, Tāwhirimātea, became so angry that he tore out his eyes and threw them into the heavens. Matariki was a time to remember those who had died in the last year. But it was also a happy event – crops had been harvested and seafood and birds had been collected. With plenty of food in the storehouses, Matariki was a time for singing, dancing and feasting. The celebration is seeing a revival in recent years and is again becoming a time to remember and celebrate together.

Matariki begins in mid-June and we will be conducting our celebrations on Wednesday 13th June. This will include a range of activities involving the whole school including

tiaha, bone and rock carving, poi, ki o rahi, putiputi, korowai and kapa haka. We would love to have as many helpers from with the community as possible to come in and support us with these activities. Once the programme is finalised it would be great to hear from those who have skills in specific areas or are just happy to come in and lend a hand. A big part of the day will also be the putting down of a hāngi that will be provided to all who wish to come along. To support us with this we will be looking for donations of kai, and most specifically meats, such as pork, lamb, mutton, beef and chicken. We are also looking for assistance with the hangi and would love to hear from anybody who has experience and is willing to help out. Also if you have any heavy steel, cast iron, weights and/or hessian sacks you are willing to part with we would love to be able to use these as part of the hāngi. We will also be looking for hot burning dry firewood closer to the time. Some of the larger, gnarly more awkward bits that don't fit in the fireplace are perfect for the purpose. Please don't get rid of these bits and if needed, we can start collecting these pieces at school. The After Hours calls are managed by HML (Homecare Medical Ltd) who will assess your needs and advise your best course of action. The on call clinician is able to access patient records, if required, to improve patient safety.

Chicken Pox Vaccine is free for children turning 15months of age and children turning 11 years of age, who have never been infected with or previously immunized against chicken pox. The vaccine is also obtainable for children, teenagers and adults but a charge will be incurred.

Flu vaccine is free for people 65 years and over AND for children living in the Hurunui aged 6 months – 17 years old. Also for people with certain chronic conditions. Please

ring for an appointment.

Zostavax – Free for 65-80 year olds.

Measles This is circulating in the Canterbury region. If you or children in your care are unimmunized please talk to the Practice Nurse for advice. There is a catch up programme in place for adults who are unsure of their immunization status.
