BUILDING WORK

The building works at the school are nearing an end (thank heavens!). Astley Construction have finished the installation of our new Habitat's 18, 19 and 20. Very soon classes will move into these new spaces. H4 will move to H18, H9 will move to H19, and H8 will move to H20. We will be starting a new Y0 class later this term and that class will be in H17 (yet to be completed).

Once these classes have moved H9 will become a break out space for the library and H8 will become a maker space for classes to use. With roll growth, we will use H4 as a space to start a new class later in the year.

There has been a delay in getting the new court area laid due in part to the storms we have had in Auckland and the need to repair existing surfaces, which has caused a shortage in suppliers across the Auckland region.
