
On Friday 18th May at MBS it is



Absent days can also add up to a large chunk of learning time that children miss out on and this can have a marked influence on their progress. Five days absent across a ten week term is the equivalent of a week of learning!! We also realise that there are many times for families that children need to be absent and we appreciate it when you let us know.
