Teachers and principals are now in negotiation with the government over our new employment agreements. The focus of these negotiations is on improvements to attract and retain the best and brightest teachers to work with our children. Please support us in trying to improve the profession, because if we can do that, we'll achieve an improved education for your child.

<u>PARKING OUTSIDE THE SCHOOL</u>: An increasing number of cars are being parked across driveways and on the yellow lines outside the school. PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN THESE AREAS.
