

This Friday 18th May Hurunui College will join the movement to stop bullying and spread kindness by taking part in Pink Shirt Day. Pink Shirt Day is asking New Zealanders to Speak Up and Stand Together to Stop Bullying. In New Zealand, Pink Shirt Day aims to create schools, workplaces and communities where all people feel safe, valued and respected. The theme this year, 'Speak Up and Stand Together' resonates with the approach we have been pushing in the school. It is often the bystanders who create the environment that allows bullying to happen. If we work together to create an environment where bullying isn't ignored and we look to support the victims rather than ignore the bullies we will have a better chance at minimising the damage and eliminating it within our schools and the wider community. Our children live in a much more complicated world with social media extending the range and invisibility of bullying type behaviour. Children now have less of an opportunity to switch off at home. Pink Shirt Day is not only for schools and bullying is not confined to the playground. Bullying and intimidation is replicated in all aspects of our society and Friday gives us all a chance to stand together to tell others that it is not accepted. If it is on the farm, school, office, shop or shearing shed, wear a pink shirt tomorrow to show your support. Students are allowed to wear a pink shirt/top and pink accessories as part of their normal uniform tomorrow. It will be great to see our students getting in behind this, not by just wearing a pink shirt but by following this up with their actions around preventing and dealing with bullying.

We are noticing at school that more and more students are being dropped or arriving at school early. Parents need to be aware that we do not provide supervision prior to 8.30am. We have noticed some children even arriving prior to 8am. Teaching staff are often in meetings in the morning and parents/caregivers must not assume that there is supervision in place. Please keep this in mind when students are leaving home or being dropped off in the morning.

This is a second reminder about our upcoming Matariki celebrations on Wednesday 13th June. Matariki will include a range of activities involving the whole school including tiaha, bone and rock carving, poi, ki o rahi, putiputi, korowai and kapa haka. We would love to have as many helpers from within the community as possible to come in and support us with these activities. Once the programme is finalised it would be great to hear from those who have skills in specific areas or are just happy to come in and lend a hand. A big part of the day will also be the putting down of a hāngi that will be provided to all who wish to come along. To support us with this we will be looking for donations of kai, and most specifically meats, such as pork, lamb, mutton, beef and chicken. We are also looking for assistance with the hāngi and would love to hear from anybody who has experience and is willing to help out. Also if you have any heavy steel, cast iron, weights and/or hessian sacks and old sheets you are willing to part with, we would love to be able to use these as part of the hāngi. We will also be looking for hot burning dry firewood closer to the time. Some of the larger, gnarly more awkward bits that don't fit in the fireplace are perfect for the purpose. Please don't get rid of these bits and if needed, we can start collecting these pieces at school. Also, any untreated pallets will make a great base for the fire. We look forward to this being a great event and a coming together of our whole community.

A quick reminder that next Wednesday is our full school cross country starting 2pm in the Hawarden domain. It is always great to see a heap of support on the day.
