Dear Bayview Families,

The wet weather has arrived! We have noticed a change in our children's behaviour as a result, they are getting hungrier! Many of our children are eating all their food at first break leaving nothing left for second break. We have a small supply of food for children who bring nothing to school to eat but are unable to keep up with this sudden demand. Could you please take some time to talk with your child about how to ensure they leave food for their lunch. Ask them if they are getting enough food. Some students are coming to school with just packets of chips and some biscuits. They really need a sandwich or something more substantial to get them through the day. Thank you for your help with this.

With the cooler weather approaching now is the time to ensure your child has their polar fleece. We have lots of them in our lost property area. This is because our children go out to play wearing them, get hot and take them off and then forget them when the bell goes and they head back into class. Sadly many jumpers are not named so we cannot return them to their owners. Our clever parents are getting the jumpers embroidered with the child's name, this is invaluable in helping to reunite them with their owner!

Please make sure your child is wearing the correct uniform. We have lots of children not wearing the correct polo shirt and many wearing non regulation jumpers. Bayview School has a uniform and we take pride in presenting ourselves wearing the correct uniform. We thank you in advance for your help with this.
