Mangere Bridge School Vaiaso o le gagana Samoa



Talofa lava,

This week we will be celebrating Vaiaso o le gagana Samoa, Samoan Language Week.

There will be a whole school launch on Monday morning with the raising of the flag and singing of the Samoan anthem, along with a video presentation re life in Samoa, followed by activities throughout the week for children to participate in, we welcome you all to join us on Monday for the launch. Our main focus this year is Language so we will have daily phrases and songs for everyone to learn.

Tuesday: Samoan Story time in the Library

Wednesday there will be Kilikiti (Samoan Cricket) and Volleyball for students to play during break times

On Thursday the Samoan Parents will be preparing a shared morning tea for the school made up of a selection of Samoan dishes. Below is the menu with a description of each dish. We understand that some of the dishes will be new and will vary with different flavours for students. Students can choose which dishes they want and portions will be "taster" size.



Koko Alaisa - Samoan Koko Rice

This is a dish made from Samoan Koko and Rice. It is often sweetened with sugar and flavoured by leaves of a lemon tree in the pot. On Friday the koko alaisa will be cooked at the school. Milk or coconut cream can be added to the dish.

Dish ingredients: koko Samoa, water, rice, sugar, pe'epe'e (coconut cream) or milk, lau moli (leaf of the orange or lemon tree)



Sua Fa'i - Sweet Banana Soup

This is a sweet soup that is usually made to make use of ripe bananas. It is made with pe'epe'e (coconut cream).

Dish ingredients: ripe bananas, sago, water, pe'epe'e (coconut cream) and sugar (optional)



PANIKEKE LAPOTOPOTO - Samoan round pancakes

Delicious traditional Samoan pancakes that are deep fried, not grilled.

Dish ingredients: Flour, baking powder, sugar, salt, egg, milk, water, oil (for deep frying)

Our school is a wastewise school and we ask that your child please bring a reusable small container/drinking cup and spoon so they are able to try the foods on offer.

On Friday 1st June the Samoan group are hosting an assembly in the auditorium at 12 pm and we ask that all children wear their cultural attire/dress smart to mark this special occasion. Everyone is welcome to join us to celebrate this special language week.
