



It was exactly this time last year that I wrote about the planned removal of the school decile funding system and the implementation of targeted funding based on student risk factors. All though on the surface this seemed a positive step forward I did express concerns around how this information will be publicly accessible, meaning that parents and our media will be able to draw conclusions not just on the income levels of families in a school area but also on potentially the perceived quality of the student and families attending that school. Sadly I see this as potentially labelling schools in a more adverse way than they have ever been before. Although it is great to hear that this proposal has been shelved, it does still leave us with the currently floored decile model. What concerns me more, is how quickly the tide turns at our ministry office and how many man hours and subsequent dollars have gone to waste that ironically could have been directly used to support at risk children in the classroom. It is hard not to feel that the mechanism of change undermines the change that needs to take place.

Our current government is now marching forward with a review planned to paint out the next 30 year for our education system. Excuse my scepticism when we struggle to implement a plan over one year let alone 30. However, I do support that all discussion includes members from all political parties and from across the education sectors. This is in an attempt to forge a collective vision that is hoped will create greater certainty and an education system less susceptible to changes in government. On the surface, this is very admirable, but with 10 elections during this timeframe, I'll resist holding my breath.

On Wednesday afternoon our uniform review team met to look at what we currently have as a uniform and looked at what we would like to retain, adjust and possibly get rid of. It was a very constructive get together and we made some excellent progress. Before any decisions are made we will put what has been considered to the wider school community for consideration. There were some very constructive conversations about availability, accessibility and consistency as students work their way through the school. We are not expecting this process to be quick, but it would be great if we had something out for wider consultation around the end of the term.

It is important for all families to also remember that we do have a current uniform that provides lots of flexibility and many options to keep students warm during the winter months. With a concealed polyprop, shirt/blouse, jersey and polar fleece there is no excuse to need to wear additional items at school. On wet and cold morning we do understand the additional need for a jacket but once at school we expect that this is not to be worn. We also allow for navy blue beanies and scarves that are available for purchase through the school office. These are available at near to cost of \$10 for a scarf and \$15 for a pure wool beanie. We are currently having repeated battles with students around the wearing of non-uniform items and these are a waste of both teacher and students time. HYP and Hurunui Rugby hoodies make a frequent appearance as do an array of coloured scarves and beanies. I'd ask that families help to support us with the wearing of our uniform correctly and with pride as it does reflect back on the school. We should not be spending our time calling home about uniform violations, but repeated offending is going to leave us with limited alternative options. It is a simple issue to solve and with a bit of team work between school and home we can prevent a lot of unnecessary conflict. To assist us, if students are unable to wear the appropriate uniform please send a note with an explanation.

We are certainly looking forward to Queen's Birthday weekend and hope many families are able to take advantage of the extra day and have a break or some additional family time.

The types of waste listed below will be accepted at the dropoff point event for FREE.

- Swimming pool and spa chemicals.
- Household and garden chemicals.
- Agricultural chemicals.
- Aerosol cans e.g. light gas and foam.
- Fluorescent lighting tubes.
- Compact fluorescent bulbs.
- Paint, stains and solvents.
- Car and electric fence batteries.
- Engine oil and unwanted fuel.
- Please note gas bottles and fire extinguishers cannot be accepted at the drop off event, but can be recycled via council's transfer stations.

- When bringing hazardous waste to the drop off event, for safety reasons, please remember to ensure chemical containers are secure, not leaking, where possible, labelled and carried upright.
