

Season 2 of the controversial programme '13 Reasons Why' has just been released on Netflix. '13 Reasons Why' is a television show, available on Netflix.com. All 13 episodes of Season 2 were released on Friday, 18th May 2018 and subscribers can watch them at any time.

'13 Reasons Why' explores issues many young people face, such as suicide and suicide bereavement, sexual violence, drug-use, bullying, domestic violence and peer pressure. The show is extremely popular, but graphic scenes and exploration of heavy issues in Season 1 left some viewers feeling distressed and in need of support. Season 2 is likely to have a similar effect. The Chief Censor has rated it RP18: Contains rape, suicide themes, drug use and bullying. It is important for parents to be aware that their children most likely have access to watching this programme, if through your own Netflix account or by using friends.

If your child is affected by watching '13 Reasons Why' they are not alone. The show is designed to have an effect on viewers, and many people find it distressing, confronting or triggers emotions. They may feel ashamed or embarrassed but please talk to someone about how you're feeling. It is important for parents to not ignore that this programme exists and there is no harm in trying to talk to your young people about the programme. If you feel there is a need for urgent support or you are worried about someone please reach out for help. If you or someone you know is in crisis, call your DHB Mental Health Crisis Team or go to your nearest Emergency Department (ED). If there is an immediate danger, call 111. If you need to talk you can call a helpline.

Access to the school pedestrian areas via vehicles has been flagged as a Health and Safety concern.

This especially relates to vehicles travelling up to the library and accessing the administration block via the Tenterden Street entrance. As students, staff and visitors are often walking through and using this area it is critical that vehicles only access this area in exceptional circumstances during the school day (8.30am - 3.15pm). For users of the library, we ask that you park in the Tenterden Street car park and if there is a physical need to park closer we ask that your initial consideration is to use the library outside of when the school is in use. When driving in the school you are not permitted to exceed walking speed and keep under 5km/hr. We understand that this will cause inconvenience, but we the safety of staff, students and visitors as is paramount.

It has been great to see a marked improvement in the wearing of our uniform over the last week. The reminders that have gone out to students are making a difference and we thank parents for reinforcing our expectations at home.

FREEDOM CAMPING BYLAW REVIEW

The Council is reviewing its Freedom Camping Bylaw. As a result of the review Council is proposing to revoke the 2011 Bylaw and replace it with a new bylaw under the Freedom Camping Act.

Why have a freedom camping bylaw?

The Freedom Camping Act provides for freedom camping in all local authority areas unless it is restricted or prohibited in accordance with a bylaw or any other enactment.

Council is only able to make a bylaw if it is considered necessary for one of the following purposes:

- to protect the area
- to protect the health and safety of people who may visit the area
- to protect access to the area.

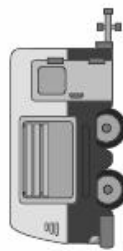
What is freedom camping?

Freedom camping means to stay overnight in any form of moveable, portable or temporary accommodation at a council controlled public area that is not a designated accommodation facility. This includes on the side of roads or at a council reserve.

What is proposed?

The bylaw identifies and provides for three forms of freedom campers:

1. Certified self-contained vehicles – required to comply with NZS 5465:2001. This requires vehicles to carry four litres of freshwater per person per day for a minimum of three days; equivalent wastewater carrying capacity and a toilet that is able to be used even when the bed is made up.



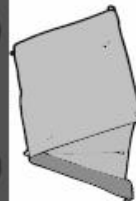
Certified self-contained vehicles to stay in a number of our settlement areas for a maximum of two nights in any 30 day period.

2. Non-self-contained vehicles – these vehicles are often station wagons or vans but can also include larger vehicles that do not comply with the self-containment standard as above.



Non-self-contained vehicles would be permitted to park outside a number of public toilet blocks in the district.

3. Tents – these users rely on a temporary external structure for accommodation. Most concrete car parks are not likely to be suitable for tents.



Two sites are available where all forms of freedom camping is permitted (including tents)

DOG CONTROL POLICY and DOG CONTROL BYLAW REVIEW

The Council is reviewing its Dog Control Policy and Dog Control Bylaw. The two documents are being reviewed concurrently and some of the changes may affect you. As a result of the review Council is proposing to revoke the Dog Control Policy 2008 and the Dog Control Bylaw and replace them with amended 2018 versions.



Where can I take my dog?

The Dog Control Policy specifies areas where dogs are prohibited, required to be on-leash or able to be exercised off-leash.

Limited changes have been made to the current areas but it is a good chance to let us know if you think changes are needed.

Have a look at the maps attached to the policy and let us know if these are ok.

Being a responsible dog owner

Most dog owners are responsible and Council is proposing to introduce a responsible dog ownership programme to recognise this.

This would affect dog registration fees. Those who quality would see a small decrease and those who don't would see a small increase.

This means that those who use the dog control services the most would pay more to reflect this.

I've lost my dog...

The most common dog-related calls Council receive regard roaming, lost or found dogs.

Usually we return the dog home for free provided the dog has been registered, micro-chipped and finding the dog is not a regular occurrence.

This has been included as a formal policy.

Dog Parks - should we have them?

Provisions have been included in the policy and bylaw providing for the development of dog parks in the future.

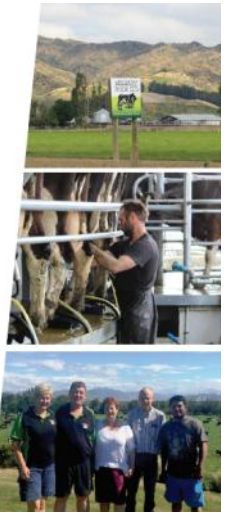
