Week 5 and Week 6 Update - Progress of our Goals

- → Vaiaso o le Gagana Samoa fa'afetai to our teachers for integrating the teaching and learning of Samoan language and culture into our Week 5 planning. If you look on our school FaceBook page, found on the website, you will see faces that absolutely glow with enjoyment for the rich experiences that have been planned and they are a part of. Each year, we build layers of learning on what took place the year before, and it is becoming evident how much our students hold onto from year to year and maybe one day they'll visit Samoa and they'll know a little of the language and culture and shine on all levels!
- → Early Childhood Network Meeting thanks to Mrs Hicks for working offsite while on Maternity leave, and ensuring this wonderful network now moves to the next level. Once again, a large number of ECE centres met alongside Primary teachers to explore more strongly, what a strong transition relationship will be into the future 4 year olds transitioning into their first year of schooling as 5 year olds how do we BEST cater for their smooth transition in our community. We have now shared our network with the rest of the schools in our Kāhui Ako.
- → MOTAT/MindLab LEOTC our Year 3 8 students have now all had their IGNITE visit to MOTAT and MindLab as part of their learning experiences outside the classroom (LEOTC). The fact that our families are committed to our Activity Fees enables us to plan these rich experiences well ahead of time, and ensure our Inquiry Learning programme has a "REAL" hands on focus to it. Those parents who

attended the trip alongside each team, will have had as much fun as the kids on this trip. Future focused learning is a valuable part of our curriculum delivery - and our students are displaying great mindsets.

Weave together the threads of learning

- This involved every teacher from every school engaged in conversations about how we are showing the best impact from our inquiries into our teaching practice. What is great about these meetings is the mixing of teachers across all schools, and seeing a consistency of understanding develop within our collegial relationships. We had our past pupils who had transitioned to OTHC talk to us about what moving from a Year 8 to a Year 9 at college felt like and we asked the question "What would you want our school to do differently to make the transition easier for you when moving from Year 8 to Year 9?" There was a resounding "More Science" response good for future planning for our primary schools. Hence our Inquiry!
- → **ECE NETWORK** we are now developing our SRS network into a more formal relationship within the Kāhui Ako. Our Across School Mentors have a Spiral of Inquiry focused on

strengthening transition. The ASM's at Bailey Rd and Stanhope are developing their inquiry around how best to include this network across all schools in our Kāhui Ako - watch this space!
