Quite a few of the Year 4, 5, and 6 children will be out and about on Monday too, as they visit two Rest Homes in Invercargill, and the Idea Services day base for adults with intellectual disabilities. They'll hopefully bring smiles to their faces with their Outreach Singing, as they interact with the residents there and lead them in singing the 'good old songs' which they've been learning.



One of our learning focuses this term has been 'Keeping Ourselves Safe', and we're very grateful for the excellent input Constable Marty Lohrey had last week as he has worked with each class to help them learn important strategies for staying safe where they are at risk of abuse.



This will be followed up on Tuesday, with Internet Safety expert John Parsons working with the children to help give them tools for staying safe when using the internet. There is also an excellent opportunity for parents to come along after school to a parent session – I would highly recommend this as we help our children protect themselves from the potential harm that internet interaction can present. Speaking of being an innocent victim of harm, we were very saddened to hear of the horrible event suffered by ex-Lumsden resident Ollie Beaumont who was attacked by dogs in Winton last Sunday. He and his family are well known to many of us, and student leader Cooper Leach has come up with the kind and thoughtful idea of having a gold coin day to raise some money to help with Ollie's recovery from his traumatic experience. Raffle for Camp – Reminder

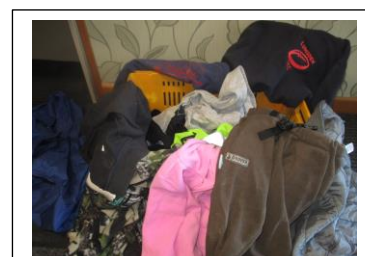

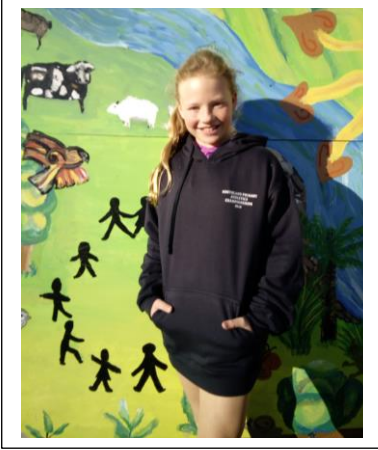
