Reports

Tomorrow students will bring home their mid year reports. Reports include an achievement grade and a work ethic grade for each curriculum area. Please note that the achievement grade is an Overall Teacher Judgement (OTJ) based on student work samples, assessment data and teacher observation. Take the opportunity to celebrate with your child the amazing effort and results they have achieved. In Term 3 the reporting process continues with Student Led Conferences and in Term 4 students receive an end of year written report.


