Fill a Shoebox Horowhenua

We recently received this letter from Fill a Shoebox Horowhenua. If anyone in the community is interested in supporting this project, please contact the Shannon School Office at the beginning of Term 3 for more information. We believe a number of Shannon families benefited from this last year.

Fill a Shoebox Horowhenua is back for 2018 and we are on the call out to the Horowhenua to support children in our community who will miss out on a true New Zealand Christmas this year.

This project arose out of the Horowhenua Strengthening Families Network in 2014 to support families facing difficulty with buying presents to put under the Christmas tree. In 2017 we came in with a new plan – 'Fill a Shoebox', we invited the community and businesses to put together boxes collated with awesome things, things they wouldn't usually receive. In 2017 we managed to give away 1000 shoes boxes to children 0-15 years between Otaki and Tokomaru.

Over the past 4 years the contribution from local organisations, business and the education sector has been overwhelming. We are laying out the challenge once again to answer a call of action to help improve Christmas for those children who would otherwise go without. Our goal for this year is 1500 boxes! This year we would love to bring Horowhenua District Council's giant inflatable soccer field with us to Shannon School on 9th November to get your community excited and involved in the project. We will have a giant Christmas tree set up to collect donations while we are there.

This year we are filling 'premade boxes' instead of shoeboxes – yay no more wrapping boxes! So if you would like a set of boxes for your school please let me know how many you need.

Kia ora


