



Room 8 – <u>Hohepa Wilson</u> – For showing great interest in what he has been learning, in particular the history of Israel.




Room 2's "Heart Melt" stories...

Proposed Strike day – 15th August

On Wednesday 15th August there is a strong possibility that teachers (and principals) across NZ will be striking. The reason we (as a collective) are taking this action is an attempt for some of the real issues and challenges we face daily to be addressed by our government. We have serious concerns about attracting and retaining teachers, needing more time to teach and less time spent on paperwork, and having truly inclusive schools where all children can learn and thrive. These things are important for our children now, and for the future of NZ's education system. We will keep you informed about whether this strike goes ahead, and whether or not it will be a full day or a half day strike.
