Welcome back to Term Three and I hope families and students have been able to enjoy some type of break over the past two weeks and hopefully make the most of the fresh snow and great weather we have had around the region. On Monday we had our start of term assembly and, as we head into Term Three, we have an increased focus on Service as one of our core values. We discussed how our value of Service originates from our school motto, Whakauru ki te ako, Wehe atu kia manaakitia - Enter to Learn, Leave to Serve. It has often been suggested that our motto is a little out-dated but it comes down to how we define service. It is certainly one of our more successful years with the 40 Hour Famine with the school being able to raise \$3002, more than a \$1000 above their target amount. This is again a wonderful example of service and a way of

bringing awareness and contributing to our global community.

This is an opportunity for the Canterbury Area Schools and associated primary schools to get together and talk about a shared vision for education and share best practice across our schools. We were thankfully blessed with fantastic weather and had a great week in town. HURUNUI Final proposal for Hurunui's representation District Council arrangements for the 2019 local elections

The Hurunui District Council has confirmed its initial proposal for 3 new wards, 10 councillors and to retain the Hanmer Springs Community Board after considering the 17 submissions received at the council meeting on 11 July 2018. The proposed representation arrangements will apply for the local elections on 12 October 2019.

Submissions

10 of the 17 submissions fully supported the Council's proposal in relation to the district's wards, the number of councillors and community boards. 7 submissions contained objections to various elements of the proposal, as follows:

- · 3 submitters requested that the boundaries be redrawn to result in:
 - o 3 councillors each in the West and East Wards (instead
 - o 3 councillors each in the South and East Wards (instead of 4 and 2)
 - o 3 councillors in each of the 3 wards (instead of 4, 4 and
- · One submitter objected to the Hanmer Springs councillor not being retained
- . One submitter objected on the grounds that the public should vote rather than submit on the proposal
- · One submitter wanted greater representation in the South Ward (more than 4)
- . One submitter considered that there was a need for a community board for Amberley as well as Hanmer Springs

The council rejected the matters raised in objections for the following reasons:

- The suggestions to redraw boundaries or to add or subtract councillor numbers were not viable and would have resulted in illogical ward boundaries due to the rural population being sparse and town populations small. The population/councillor ratio did not appear to be understood by all submitters.
- . The council did consider community boards for all of the wards after receiving early feedback on a range of proposals. The council did not consider there to be compelling reasons or sufficient support from local communities to instigate a community board for Amberley (or any other community other than Hanmer Springs) and believes that the council's own committee structure supports each community in a similar manner to community boards. With individual community committees already in place in Amberley, Amuri, Cheviot, Glenmark and Hurunui, and each having the same council delegations as the Hanmer Springs Community Board, the council considered that the submissions supported the continuation of these committees with only one submission supporting a new community board for Amberley.

The population that each councillor represents must be within a 10% plus or minus range of 1,280, being Hurunui's population of 12,800 divided by 10 councillors (between 1,151 and 1,408 each councillor). (Section 19V(2) of the Local Electoral Act 2001)

Final proposal

The final proposal is that the council comprise of 10 councillors elected from three wards, and the mayor; and that the one community board for Hanmer Springs remains in

The new representation model is shown in the table above.

Appeals and objections

Any person who made a submission on the council's proposal may lodge an appeal against the council's decision. An appeal must relate to the matters raised in that person's submission. Any person who objects to the final proposal may lodge an objection to the council's final proposal. Any objection must identify the matters to which the objection relates.
