



Love Food, Hate Waste, Save Money



Did you know that New Zealand households throw away over \$560 of food each year?

There are many simple things that you can do to reduce this waste and save you and your family money:

Plan your meals for the week, write a shopping list, and just buy what you need.

Get active with your fridge, put the items that need to be used first up to eye level.

Store food correctly; keep bread in the freezer and potatoes in a dark cool place. Avoid UFOs (unidentified frozen objects) by labelling leftovers so everyone knows what's inside and when they need to be used by.

Get creative; stew leftover fruit, use leftover roast vegetables and meat on a pizza, chop up bread into croutons or breadcrumbs.
