
Principal's Message

Students are in the process of delivering their 3 minute speeches.

The 3 minute speech is possibly one of the only aspects of the school curriculum that remains unchanged from the days when we (parents/cargivers) attended school. And... I bet you still remember that speech you delivered as a 12 year old. Perhaps there is a reason why you remember it?

A year or so ago I completed some research into what students perceived as their best piece of writing and the piece they were most proud of. Overwhelmingly, the results were their speeches. They were writing on a topic they were interested in and passionate about. The fact they were to perform it in front of their peers meant they invested more time and dedication into reworking and perfecting the speech than any other writing samples.

Now, I also have a theory on why we remember our speeches for a long time. Below is a basic graphic showing the percentage of memory retention and retrieval from different learning strategies.



3 minute speeches are valuable and also daunting, let us support our childen in this up-coming learning challenge and be proud of them.

Strike Action – School Closed for Instruction

Dear Parents and Caregivers

The Board of Trustees can't provide teaching for students during the upcoming strike

The NZEI has advised the Ponsonby Intermediate Board of Trustees that the teachers at our school will be taking strike action for a full day on **Wednesday 15 August 2018.**

The Board has carefully considered the availability of teaching staff, and unfortunately decided that we can't provide the normal teaching services during the strike. It's important that you make alternative arrangements for the care of your child/children on the day of the strike.

If this is difficult we can still supervise a small number of students if required. Please contact the office to indicate if your child/children will need this.

I know that this is inconvenient for parents and students alike, but please be assured that student safety is our main concern.

Thank you for your understanding



The primary teachers' and principals' union has decided on a full day strike on Wednesday 15 August. The school will be closed that day.

The result is in response to member feedback that many wanted to strike for a full day to send a stronger message to the Government about the need for time to teach, time to lead, and turning around the teacher shortage that is at crisis levels.

Members felt the Government's previous offer did not address workload issues, extra learning support or ways to stem the growing crisis in recruiting and retaining teachers.

Strikes are legal under the Employment Relations Act. If our school were legally closed during a strike, we do not have to make up the time at the end of the year. Under <u>Section 65A of the Education Act 1989</u> when a school is closed for instruction for any day because of strike action, the school is deemed to be open in terms of counting days.

As with our Pay Equity campaign for school support staff, ECE and Ministry of Education Support Workers, it's essential that the wider community understands the reasons for industrial action and supports what we are trying to achieve for our students and quality public education.

Parent and whānau support is necessary to give the Government the mandate and courage to take the bold steps that are needed.

Primary school members are discussing how to talk with families on our day of community engagement this Friday 3 August. Support from the wider membership means a lot to primary members.

The key thing we want to communicate is *why* we need to take this action. It's about kids' futures. It's about attracting and retaining teachers, having more time to teach and having truly inclusive schools where all children can learn and thrive.

That's why we do what we do and that's why we're taking a stand - for our students.

The week is based around two of our school goals – Expressing Ourselves and Making Connections. The timetable for the week includes presentations in assemblies and also caters for the students taking part in the school Roadshow.

Ponsonby Intermediate School Jersey


We now have a jersey available to students. You can order the jersey (hoodie or sweater) using the link below. Ordering for this garment will close again on August 3rd.


