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TEACHERS STRIKE ACTION

On Wednesday 15th August all Primary and Intermediate teachers are scheduled to go on strike. The Bayview School Board of Trustees have made the decision to close the school during this strike. The Board felt that for health and safety reasons i.e. lack of supervision, closing the school was the only option.

Please know that our teachers take this kind of action very seriously as it is not something we like to do, but it is time to stand up for education! Support services and financial support has been dwindling over the past 10 years with little or no investment into the education sector. It has become increasingly more difficult to get support for students with learning needs, we have to jump through hoops to get new classrooms, there is a chronic shortage of teachers. Please know it is not just about the money. Your kids deserve a quality education system with the right supports in place. It is time to fight for one!

Dear Bayview Families,

Wow it is week 2 of term 3 already, time flies when you are having fun! We have had an awesome start to the term. The children are happy and healthy and the climate within the school is very positive. Thank you to all the parents who allowed their children to just 'be' during the break.

BUILDING WORK

Things have progressed quickly over the break time to allow us to start our new Year 0 class in Habitat 17. On Friday 20th July our Kaumatua came and blessed this classroom ready for the tamariki. You will see that there are still some fences around these new classrooms and that is because the base boards are still to be installed and some other finishing details.

On Tuesday 30th July our new court area was finished i.e. the asphalt was laid. Pro Floors, the company completing this work, are now working on concrete paths, drainage and fixing the broken concrete at the front of the hall. I would love to tell you a finishing date for this but it really is weather dependent.

I would like to thank everyone and in particular the kids for your patience and understanding around all of this building work. It has been quite disruptive and frustrating but the final result will be worth it!

ACCELERATED PROGRESS

During any school year a child will make on average a year's progress with their learning. Many students make accelerated progress by setting goals and then really applying themselves with an action plan to achieve these goals.

Achievement can be considered accelerated when a student makes more than one year's progress over a year on a trajectory that will indicate they are achieving at or above the expected level at the end of year 6 or sooner.

At the end of term 2 we celebrated all the students that made accelerated progress during the first 6 months of school.

The stats look like this:

Reading – 183 students

Writing – 105 students

Mathematics – 70 students

These children are not necessarily the top in their class in these learning areas but they are the students who have set goals and developed an action plan to achieve the goal.

We are very proud of these children and I know they are proud of themselves! Ask your child if they were celebrated.

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS

We have had lots of queries about the out of zone enrolment process. The time line for this is dictated by the Ministry of Education. I can advise that applications for out of zone enrolments for the 2019 academic year will open on Monday 17th September. All applications must be in by Thursday 18th October. No late applications can be considered. The application form will be available on our school website from the 17th September. Please let your friends and family know these very important dates if they live out of zone and are wanting their child to attend Bayview School.

CARPARK AREA

Many of you will be aware of the brawl that occurred in the school/Kindy/Community Centre carpark last weekend. Unfortunately lots of bottles were broken in this vicinity during this disturbance. The people involved in this disturbance were not from Bayview so we will not let their behaviour define the Bayview community. Often we hear about the bad things more than we do the good.
