New Children

The family of 4 children I mentioned last week have started school with us.

Elite, Vogue, Zarhni and Slade have joined us from Australia and we have also had Maiya join us from just north of Auckland.

We welcome these children and hope they and their whanau enjoy their time with Huia Range School and in Dannevirke.

Strike Action

Teachers and Principals have voted to strike on Wednesday 15th of August.

The Board of Trustees will be making a decision over the next week as to what will happen to ensure your children are safe and whether the school is open or closed for the day.

The Board will be working through the legal and safety requirements before they make this decision.

The reasons behind the strike action are much bigger than is usually reported in the media.

The concerns across New Zealand are around:

- The lack of in-depth, continuous support for our children that have moderate to severe learning, behavioural and/or developmental needs. More specialist teachers and support workers are urgently needed.
- 2. The huge shortage of teachers (tired of hearing about Auckland a massive problem in Dannevirke!)
- 3. The retention of teachers a large percent of new teachers resign within 3 years of starting teaching.
- 4. Pay rates of teachers.

Parent Interviews

It was great to see such a high turnout of parents, grandparents and caregivers meeting with teachers on Monday and Tuesday nights.

This is the highest number of interviews we have ever had and it is really encouraging to see the interest in the children's education.

The teachers have commented to me that the interviews were very positive and they enjoyed meeting some parents they haven't previously met.

The main feed back about the new report format was that there are 2 issues:

- There was not enough difference between some of the words used, particularly the words strongly and consistently. This made it difficult for parents to understand, what exactly, this meant for their child.
- Because curriculum levels were reported against, but weren't broken down into smaller steps (as they were using National Standards) it was difficult to gauge progress.

Both of these concerns are important and will be looked at before end of the year reports are written.

Thank you to all the whanau who attended interviews and thank you for your feedback and the positive way you all approached these interviews.
