## SOCIAL SKILL – PROBLEM-SOLVING



Problem-solving is one of the essential

skills a child needs to learn. As teachers and parents, we are in the best position to teach children these skills. As adults, we often have a tendency to sort things out for our children in order to resolve issues. We tend to rush in and fix things up to make them feel better. It is much better if we can give our children the skills and processes to be able to work things out for themselves.


Children need to be able to stop, think, and make decisions and choices to help them resolve issues. Here are some ways to teach your child problem-solving skills:

- Don't be a helicopter parent give your child some space and don't hover over them.
- Provide a range of possible solutions allow your child to choose a solution for themselves.
- Make it fun make some difficulties fun by using a positive attitude.
- Try some DIY together learn together. Let your child see you in action solving problems for yourself.
- Teach them some basic problem-solving steps Identify the problem, break it up into manageable parts and tackle the parts one at a time, until the problem is solved.
- Allow your child to experience failure if we don't do this, we are unwilling for our children to learn. (excerpts taken from: Inspired Parenting Tips and 10 Ways to Teach Your Child to be Problem Solvers).

The next time your child comes to you with a problem, try some of these ideas out together.

### **ENROLMENTS FOR 2019**

To assist with planning for 2019 we need to check we have an accurate list of enrolments for next year. **A)** If you fall into one of following categories, please contact the Office by August 31:

 You live in zone and have a new entrant child who turns 5 in 2019 and you have not already given preenrolment details to the Office.

ii) You live in zone and currently have a child attending a different school that you intend to enrol at Papakowhai in 2019.

If you have a friend or family member that does not have a child currently attending Papakowhai School and you think that they may fall into one of the above categories, please get them to contact the Office also. If you are unclear about the boundaries of the school zone, please refer to our website.

**B)** If you fall into one of following categories, please contact Acting Principal Caine Webster, before August 31, by email to <u>caine@papakowhai.school.nz</u>

You currently live out of zone (or will be out of zone from the January 1 2019 changes) but have children already attending Papakowhai School, have a new entrant child who turns 5 in 2019 and you have not already completed an enrolment form for 2019.

ii) You have a child currently attending PapakowhaiSchool and you are planning to enrol them at a differentschool in 2019.

#### Out of Zone Places for 2019

As an interim step while we await clarification about a proposed school at Aotea, there will be up to 10 out of zone places in 2019 for Year 1 siblings of current pupils. There will be no places for children who do not have a current sibling at school.

The process for this is as follows:

•Pre-enrolment of out of zone Year 1 children who have a sibling currently attending Papakowhai School will need to be received by August 31 2018.

•The BOT will determine from the pre-enrolments how many places are likely to be available in 2019 for out of zone Year 1 siblings of current students.

•On September 11, by notice in a newspaper, the BOT will advertise the number of out of zone places that the Board

has determined and seek applications by September 21, 2018.

•A ballot, if required, will take place on Wednesday 26 September.
