PAPAKOWHAI SCHOOL NEWSLETTER Week 3 ● Term 3 ● 8 August 2018

Dear Parents/Caregivers

On Monday a letter from the Board of Trustees was sent home explaining details about the strike on Wednesday 15 August and the action the school will be taking (closing for instruction). There will also be no Before or After School Care that day. I would like to take this opportunity to shed some light on why the teaching profession is moved to take strike action and why we need your help and support.

Firstly, this is not only about pay, but about the quality of education that your child receives.

There is a serious crisis occurring in Education. We have teachers leaving the profession in droves; a large percentage of our workforce is about to retire (with others postponing retirement), fewer people entering teacher training and many graduates leaving the job in the first 5 years of teaching.

This is being called the 40% problem:

- 40% of teachers are due to retire in the next 10 years.
- 40% less teachers are being trained!

Up until recently, the crisis has been most serious in Auckland, but now other parts of the country are finding themselves in the same position that Auckland was in only few years ago. We have been very lucky recently with regards to filling teaching vacancies and were able to employ good quality teachers. The number of applicants for these positions was very low compared with previous years. Many schools are having to re-advertise jobs over and over and, in extreme cases when a vacancy cannot be filled, the class affected is distributed across other classes.

When we take this aspect into account, along with the 40% problem, our profession is haemorrhaging teachers.

What exactly is this 'crisis' the profession is concerned about?

- Significant groups of teachers are leaving in the first 5 years of teaching. Teachers no longer stay in the profession for life. High workloads and stress, combined with comparatively low wages (with other professions) mean teaching is no longer a lifelong career choice for many.
- There are fewer teachers applying for jobs. In many cases, schools are getting NO applicants.
- Support for children with learning and behavioural needs is under resourced. We have increasing numbers of children arriving at school with significant learning and behavioural needs, and only the most severe of these are able to access additional resourcing, placing additional pressure and workload on teachers to manage the range of diverse needs in front of them. We are not trained social workers or counsellors, yet increasingly we are expected to perform these roles as well as teach.
- Finding a classroom teacher is hard but, finding a reliever is even harder! (those wonderful and essential people that come into our school to teach a class when the day to day teacher is sick or attending professional development). We are extremely lucky to have our wonderful relievers and are hanging onto them like gold.

So what exactly are we asking for?

Our claim with the Ministry is not just about pay, but ensuring teachers work conditions are such that teaching once again becomes an attractive profession to join, and that once recruited, we are able to retain teachers in the teaching workforce.

- More teachers so your kids can get more attention
- More resources/specialist staff to support children with additional learning needs
- A pay jolt to salaries for teachers to address the teacher shortage – so that your children will have a teacher in the future

It is **our students, the next generation, that are being impacted** right now by this crisis. It is only because schools are being creative that things are 'sort of' ticking along. It is a Band-Aid at best and that Band-Aid has run out of stickiness! **Teachers and leaders have had enough.**

The last time we went on strike as a profession was 24 years ago. We do not like causing disruption to our students and their families but things must change.

Please understand this is not just about pay, it's much deeper than that. This teacher shortage is serious, please understand that if we do not do something about making it affordable to teach in our cities, attractive to want to be a teacher and do something about ensuring our teachers and leaders have the time and resources to manage their workload – then your child, your neighbour's child and all children are the ones that are going to be short changed.

Please show your support for our teachers and to reiterate Papakowhai School is closed for students on Wednesday 15 August and there is no Before or After School Care

KAURI BLOCK HELPERS

As part of our continued efforts to raise the standards of literacy in school, we're hoping to encourage some parents to come in and help with reading in Kauri Block. Reading regularly to an adult has been shown to significantly increase the rate of progress that children can make with reading.

As there are many of you who bring your children to school, we're hoping that there would be some parents/grandparents/carers who would enjoy coming into school for the first 30 minutes of the morning to listen to some children read. Typically, you'd work one-to-one with two or three children: spending 10 minutes with each child talking about the book they're reading and listening to them read. You'd work with the same children each week, getting to know them and watching them progress. Ideally you'd be able to come in twice a week, but once a week would be fine too.

ENROLMENTS FOR 2019

To assist with planning for 2019 we need to check we have an accurate list of enrolments for next year.

- **A)** If you fall into one of following categories, please contact the Office by August 31:
- i) You live in zone and have a new entrant child who turns 5 in 2019 and you have not already given preenrolment details to the Office.
- ii) You live in zone and currently have a child attending a different school that you intend to enrol at Papakowhai in 2019.

If you have a friend or family member that does not have a child currently attending Papakowhai School and you think that they may fall into one of the above categories, please get them to contact the Office also. If you are unclear about the boundaries of the school zone, please refer to our website.

- **B)** If you fall into one of following categories, please contact Acting Principal Caine Webster, before August 31, by email to caine@papakowhai.school.nz
- i) You currently live out of zone (or will be out of zone from the January 1 2019 changes) but have children already attending Papakowhai School, have a new entrant child who turns 5 in 2019 and you have not already completed an enrolment form for 2019.
- ii) You have a child currently attending Papakowhai School and you are planning to enrol them at a different school in 2019.

Out of Zone Places for 2019

There will be up to 10 out of zone places in 2019 for Year 1 siblings of current pupils. There will be no places for children who do not have a current sibling at school. The process for this is as follows:

- Pre-enrolment of out of zone Year 1 children who have a sibling currently attending Papakowhai School will need to be received by August 31 2018.
- •The BOT will determine from the pre-enrolments how many places are likely to be available in 2019 for out of zone Year 1 siblings of current students.
- •On September 11, by notice in a newspaper, the BOT will advertise the number of out of zone places that the Board has determined and seek applications by September 21, 2018.
- •A ballot, if required, will take place on Wednesday 26 September.

ASB SCHOOL DONATION VOUCHER

ASB are continuing to offer a special deal to schools. They will donate \$500 to schools that bank with ASB for every new home loan over \$250,000 taken out. A voucher needs to be presented directly to them or the offer must be mentioned during the home loan appointment.
