

It has been a hectic past five days at Hurunui College, with our students being involved in a large range of different activities. Last Friday saw the annual Year 7 - 13 ski trip travel up to Mt Lyford for a stunning day on the mountain. The lack of snow fall over recent weeks made us a little nervous about what the conditions would actually be like, but we were pleasantly surprised. Conditions improved as the day progressed and the complete lack of wind made for a fantastic day's skiing.

From Monday the theme shifted to public speaking and the school speech finals. Again our students showed their passion for public speaking with our students placing first and second in both the junior and intermediate categories. Well done to Maddie Brinston and Roddy Murchison for winning their respective categories.

On Tuesday we welcomed the first of our two new volunteers, Jessica Viereck to New Zealand and Hurunui College. Jessica arrived midday Tuesday after 36 hours of travel from Germany. She will be joined by Johannes Kuhn next Friday. Following his arrival we will be conducting our mid year powhiri on the morning of Monday 20th August. All students new to the school this year will join the manuhiri as part of the powhiri. Family are welcome to join the manuhiri alongside their children. The powhiri will begin at

approximately 9am on the Monday morning.

There has been a lot of media coverage recently around the upcoming teacher strike action on Wednesday 15th August. Although we do support our fellow teachers in the quest for improved pay and working condition, this does not involve Hurunui College. It will be school as normal for staff and students on this day.

I'm sure it will be another busy week ahead and I look forward to being part of the on-going success of our students.

Chicken Pox Vaccine Free for children turning 15 months of age and children turning 11 years of age, who have never been infected with or previously immunized against chicken pox. The vaccine is also obtainable for children, teenagers and adults but a charge will be incurred.

Flu vaccine Free for people 65 years and over AND for children living in the Hurunui aged 6 months – 17 years old. Also for people with certain chronic conditions. Please ring for an appointment.

Zostavax Free for 65-80 year olds.

Measles This is circulating in the Canterbury region. If you or children in your care are unimmunized please talk to the

Practice Nurse for advice. There is a catch up programme in place for adults who are unsure of their immunization status.

Smoking Cessation Advice is available at the Health Centre if you need help to quit smoking.
