Principal's Message

Developing student leadership positions has been a priority goal for this year. In this week's newsletter we showcase feedback from the various leadership groups in the school.

Student leadership encourages children to actively engage with school life in authentic settings. Students will apply (or in some cases be chosen) for positions that they are passionate about. Often these roles involve organisational skills, communication skills and teamwork. It is the aspect of "teaching others" that I really enjoy.

By "teaching others" for example - Eco Warriors messages about the SPCA Cupcake Day - students bring a powerful element of their own voice into the curriculum. By developing multiple leadership positions we put student agency as another driver for school improvement and have the children at the decision making table.

To support these various groups we have created the 'Leaders' Loft'. It is a space deliberately set up for student leadership meetings. The Maori proverb on the wall Me Whakaro Rangatira means - Think Like a Leader.

While it may not be possible for every student to achieve a leadership position, you can be assured that the teachers do monitor and track each individual student over their two year Ponsonby Experience. Our leadership positions are also regularly added to throughout the year – in fact we will be awarding more on Friday!





Enrolments for 2019

At the moment we are busy processing all the enrolments for next year. Ponsonby Intermediate School has always accepted many students from out of zone and this will continue. I should also make it clear that my goal is for class sizes and the school roll to remain the same heading into 2018 and beyond.

To help provide certainty, it is important all enrolments for 2019, whether you are 'in zone' or 'out of zone' are received by the end of this term – Friday 28 September.

You will be notified of your acceptance by email and formal letter in mid-October. Information on term dates, stationery and uniform will be included.

Please let your friends and neighbours know these deadlines – the transition process from primary school into intermediate is important. We will visit all our major contributing primary schools for Year 6 transitioning in November - Ponsonby Primary, Freemans Bay Primary, Richmond Rd Primary, Bayfield Primary, Gladstone Primary, Westmere Primary, Pt Chevalier Primary, and Grey Lynn Primary.



NMSSA (National Study of Student Achievement)

Purpose: The purpose of national monitoring is to assess and understand student achievement across the curriculum at the primary level in New Zealand and to monitor changes in achievement over time. The curriculum areas being assessed in 2018 are Mathematics & Statistics and Social Studies.

What will the students be asked to do?

Up to 25 students in Year 8 will be randomly selected to participate in the study.

Students will work with the teacher assessor on a mathematics paper-and-pencil assessment.

Some of these students will also complete computer-based and team activities, questionnaires and a one-to-one interview.

Students have the right to decline to answer any questions and/or may withdraw at any stage.

The sessions are spread out over the 2½ days. The maximum time any one child would be involved is 4 hours. Some of the children will only be involved for 1 hour.

If your child has been selected and / or you would like to know more the NMSSA teacher will be available in the library from 3.15-3.45 next Monday afternoon.


