BUILDING WORK

Thank you all for staying positive around the completion of our new court area. Unfortunately the weather did not play very nicely which affected our ability to lay the new court, and then when the company were fixing the broken concrete paths they broke water pipes, not once but 5 times. They have now had to dig up the brand new concrete as there was a broken water pipe underneath... this has delayed the completion of this work, again.

I am so grateful that our kids are resilient and that they have learned to cope under quite adverse conditions!

One day soon we will have a new court area and it will be fabulous!

TEACHERS STRIKE ACTION

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Thank you so much for the wonderful messages of support for the teachers as they went on strike on Wednesday. To be honest we didn't want to go on strike as we all really enjoy the work we do, but we needed to get behind our colleagues and support the efforts to:

- Get more teachers into the profession. (Did you know that there are 40% fewer people training to be teachers and that 40% of teachers within their first 5 years leave the profession)
- Get more support for students with learning needs. (Resources have been dwindling over the past 10 years, e.g. as a speech language therapist left they were not replaced)
- Get more time for teachers to do paper work. (NZ primary teachers have some of the least amounts of release time to do paper work across the OECD, and far less than secondary teachers get)

You may be aware that at times your child's class is split. This is because when teachers are sick Mrs Matuku spends her morning phoning through a list of relieving teachers to teach this class. Many of our relievers have been enticed into full time teaching because of the major shortage of teachers (particularly in Auckland). If we are unsuccessful in finding a teacher then we have no other option but to split the class. This is not an easy fix and won't be sorted overnight but unless we stand up for our kids now then nothing will change and your child may very well miss out!

You may have heard that the union are now talking about a further two day strike. Please know that the Bayview School staff are not keen to go on strike again. We will keep you informed of any developments around this.

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS

We have had lots of queries about the out of zone enrolment process. The time line for this is dictated by the Ministry of Education. I can advise that applications for out of zone enrolments for the 2019 academic year will open on **Monday 17th September**. All applications must be in by **Thursday 18th October**. No late applications can be considered. The application form will be available on our **school website from the 17th September**. Please let your friends and family know these very important dates if they live out of zone and are wanting their child to attend Bayview School.

SPORTS TEAMS

At Bayview School we try to provide as many opportunities as possible for children to join sports teams. Any money that is charged is specifically for the associations and is paid directly to them. If your child wants to pull out of a team we are unable to provide a refund. Hopefully you would work through this with your child so they understand that by pulling out of a team it negatively impacts that team and they may be spoiling the game for them, especially if there are no longer enough players. It is important that the children understand that by joining a team they commit to all practices and games. That is what a great team member does.

We are incredibly grateful to the many parents who coach, manage, attend games and support our children in positive and affirming ways. Our kids need your encouragement and need to know that their efforts are being appreciated so please keep your side-line talk (yelling) positive.

If you have any queries around sport please talk with Nathan Hinton (H5) or Katrina Cray (H6). Please do not complain to poor Shannon in the office, she does not organise the sports and is not able to sort your issues around sport.
