WAIKARI CAMPGROUND RECYCLING FACILITIES

It is disappointing to have to report back to the local community that on-going problems are being experienced with the recycling drop off facilities in Waikari Campground. These facilities have been provided to encourage visitors to the district (i.e. those staying at the campground) to maximise their diversion of waste from landfill by providing clearly sign written recycling bins, as they do not have the option of using the council's kerbside collection service. It has been noted that some individuals who live in the local community are opting to use these bins as a method of disposing of their household waste. Unfortunately this is

contaminating recycling, which has already been carefully sorted according to the councils criteria and thus is resulting in the disposal of the entire contents of the recycling drop off bin.

If this continues it will be necessary for the recycling bins to be removed and relocated to another area of the district. Therefore the community is requested to utilise councils kerbside collection service (recycling and refuse bags can be purchased from Waikari Auto Services and Hawarden Four Square) and the drop off facilities provided at Amberley and Culverden transfer stations. If waste continues to be deposited at this recycling facility, it will be deemed illegally dumped under the Litter Act (1979) for which an infringement maybe issued to those responsible.
