Camellia Project

Last Friday, artist Wendy Hannah came and spoke to the children about the 125th



anniversary of women getting the vote in New Zealand. She explained to them about how white camellia's became a symbol of the women's suffrage, as each person who signed a petition was given a flower. Her aim in the Camellia Project is to make over 31,000 plastic camellias (the number of signatures on the suffrage petition) which will form a giant chandelier. The children took part in the project by making camellias out of old plastic bottles. When the chandelier is complete, it will be displayed publicly and our school will be recognised as helping to make it. They also started a

giant jellyfish chandelier which we will display once it is finished.
