## Principal's Message

Over the past fortnight many academic challenges on offer here at Ponsonby have been completed.

Science Fair, Speeches, Mathex, ICAS Exams and the Bandquest have all taken place. These academic challenges are satisfying for students and often build great self-esteem. These activities are often described as assessments **of** learning or summative assessments. While they have merit, it is our belief that your children can learn even more when we focus on assessments **for** learning. The recent Student Led Conferences are an example of your children describing what they have been learning and where their next learning steps are. The specialist teaching model we run here at Ponsonby enables teachers to use their 'expertise' and develop robust assessment **for** learning opportunities. We expect our students to be able to articulate their next learning steps.

I'm sure you are aware that with the removal of National Standards the government is calling for a *focus on progress and achievement*. In essence, we will be going back to focus on the true intent of the New Zealand Curriculum 2008.

The government is also conducting a review of 'Tomorrow's Schools', which forms the basis of the whole education system here in Aotearoa.

## Social Media and Online Bullying

As a school, we have currently been dealing with a number of issues around inappropriate and harmful behaviour online that has been taking place outside of school hours.

To help educate the students, we have a special guest coming in next week to talk to the students about online behaviour and some of the real world consequences. The speaker will also talk about the law around using social media and what to do if you are witness to harmful behaviour.

#### Online Bullying - Ponsonby Intermediate School's Policy and Procedure

Students are unable to access Social Media sites at school through the school wi-fi. This means that online bullying through these sites is very unlikely to happen during school time. However, if a parent brings to our attention an incident that involves online bullying we have a moral and social obligation to act accordingly.

Each incident that is brought to our attention is dealt with on a case by case basis depending on where it took place, who is involved and the severity or inappropriateness of the behaviour. It is also important that these incidences are dealt with as collaboratively as possible with the parents whose children are involved.

Our main priority and responsibility is to educate and raise awareness around the potential harm caused by Social Media as well as ways students can keep themselves safe such as:

- Never share their password unless it's a parent or guardian
- Do not sign up to Social Media sites if they do not meet the age restriction
- Report abusive or offensive behaviour to a trusted adult
- Do not reply to offensive or abusive behaviour

All the students will be learning more about this in our health classes. We encourage you to discuss the content of these health lessons at home with your child.

We also feel it is important to work together with parents in raising awareness and putting systems in place to keep your child safe. Some things you can do at home are:

- Know their password to Social Media sites
- Make sure they are on the devices in a shared space eg lounge, dining room
- Time restrictions on devices and clear expectations when using the device
- Parental locks such as Watchdog on the internet provider
- Discourage your child from signing up to social media sites if they do not meet the age restrictions

Teachers and parents must work together to ensure the students are getting a clear message about how to keep safe and behave online.

#### Our young people and their well-being

There has been a lot out there in the media recently, which makes us consider our young people and their own well-being. Some are asking how do we address this?

- Some of our young people from time to time can feel anxious or low. This may not be visibly explicit to us as adults.
- From time to time we can all feel this way, this is normal, but we do need a place to share our feelings where these can be validated and shown empathy.
- Sometimes kids are seeing and hearing things online that may expose them to topics they may want to explore. This is OK but best discussed with you.
- Sharing some quality time may mean they may open up to you. Encouraging them to share with another trusted adult if not you can be equally important.

At Ponsonby Intermediate we encourage our kids to talk to you, their teachers, or our school counsellor if they have a problem. Students receive each week a Health lesson, Positively Ponsonby session, and a Hauora lesson that gives our kids a chance to discuss relevant issues that they face as 11, 12, 13 year olds. Currently, students are discussing inclusivity and what this looks like for them.
