Last week I was privileged to spend three days at the New Zealand Area Schools' Conference in Christchurch.

The Area School Conference is a special event as it brings together teachers, school leaders, Board of Trustees members and administrators from across the full length and from some of the most far-flung and isolated areas of our country. It has a very unique vibe and reflects what is special about Area Schools. What stood out for me at the conference this year was the feeling that there is a shift away from an assessment-driven environment, back towards developing passion and enthusiasm for learning.

This was no better highlighted than with the presentation from Dr Welby Ings (and yes that is actually his name) on "Disobedient Teaching". The focus of his presentation was around the need to not lock learners into a regime of comparative testing against presumed standards or the performances of others results. He talked about a generation of students who are coming into universities without the ability to think outside of what they perceive is expected of them. They want to know the assessment criteria, the marking schedule and if there are exemplars that they can look at. He sees this as the potential for a terrible wasting of potential. He sees us as a small country needing to focus on innovation and believes that this is a thing that must be consciously grown and it falls on teachers to be part of this. Without the ability to originate, innovate, fail, recover, and uniquely position, we can't compete with nations who politically and economically have far greater resources than us. Growing creativity requires space and teachers and learners need time and flexibility to do this.

The current obsession with assessment only works to stifle this innovation and we must remember that learning and teaching are processes, not products. I would encourage anybody to take the time to read his book or watch one of his presentations on TED Talks.

Another highlight of the conference is always the Student Excellence Award presentations. Prior to acknowledging this year's recipients, Miriam Clarke presented to the delegates on her adventures since receiving this award last year. It never ceases to amaze me how highly our Area School students can perform, and in many cases outperform, on the national stage. One recipient who stood out to me this year was Rebecca Jones from Oxford Area School. Along with being a strong academic achiever

Rebecca holds records in archery at the national and open level and gained gold medals in national intermediate, cadet and open divisions. Rebecca represented New Zealand at the Trans Tasman and Oceania Championships where she broke a New Zealand record and was awarded two gold medals and a bronze. Most recently she has earned her position on the New Zealand Youth Olympic Games team, the first time an archer has represented New Zealand at the Youth Games. It is so great to see our students achieving so highly and being able to be recognised at our conference.

On a more local level, it was fantastic to see the students out and about at the annual 7 Aside Tournament on Tuesday. It is a great coming together of our local primary schools and a real positive of the day is seeing our secondary students acting in leadership roles as coaches and referees alongside our younger participants (pictured below). It was a great day and a big thank you to our sports team and helpers for making it all happen.

A crucial reminder to parents is that tomorrow the school will be closed for all students. Friday 31st August is our annual Jumbo Teacher Only Day hosted at Oxford Area School. No buses will be running and there is no supervision provided at school. The students can enjoy a three day weekend.

Lastly, student Board of Trustees nominations close on Monday. Any students in Year 9-13 can be nominated for this role. I encourage any who are keen to give it a go.
