Hurunui District's Final Representation Arrangements for the 2019 Local Elections

On 11 July 2018, the Hurunui District Council confirmed its final proposal for representation arrangements to apply to the 12 October 2019 local government elections. This decision was made public shortly after, including notice that people had the right to appeal or object. No appeals or objections were received in respect of the final proposal, therefore the representation arrangements for the Hurunui District Council's 2019 local elections will be the same as in the final proposal.

New Representation

From 12 October 2019, the council will comprise of 10 councillors elected from three wards, plus the mayor and the community board for Hanmer Springs.

The new representation arrangement is shown in the table opposite.

The population that each councillor represents must be within a 10% plus or minus range of 1,280 being Hurunui's population of 12,800 divided by 10 councillors (population of between 1,151 and 1,408 per councillor). [Section 19V(2) of the Local Electoral Act 2001]

Proposed Three Waters Services Bylaw, Three Waters Services Policy & Backflow Prevention Policy

Let's talk about water.

- Do you own a café or restaurant?
- Does your business discharge to the council's wastewater system?
- Is your business or house connected to the council's water supply?
- Do you have a swimming pool or spa pool (domestic or commercial)?

If you answered Yes to any of the above, the changes under the Proposed Three Waters Services Bylaw, Three Waters Services Policy & Backflow Prevention Policy could affect you.

The council is proposing to make changes related to our three waters services (water supply network, wastewater network, stormwater network), including rules about the discharge of trade waste and the management of the risk of backflow to the water supply.
