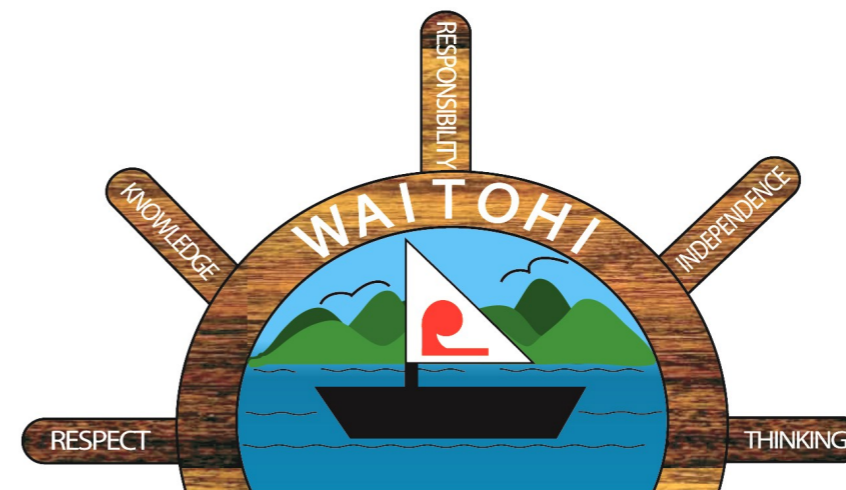

Principal's Message

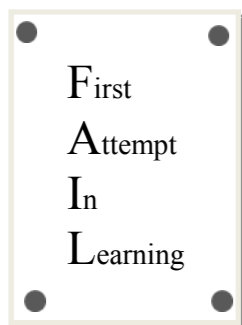
