
DRAMA

Southern DHB has been able to employ a number of dental therapist graduates to fill vacant positions and we are gradually working towards getting our mobile service back on the road. We are looking forward to resuming our normal mobile dental clinic service at the start of the New Year. We plan to be in the Maniototo Region on the week commencing 19th March 2019.

In the meantime we'd like to remind all families of the importance of good oral health through regular brushing with fluoride toothpaste, avoiding sugary foods and drinks, water is best.
