When the learning is relevant to the students life they become more engaged and the learning is much more meaningful. Congratulations also to our bowlers. Angus Manson and Kelvin Stratford came 3rd in the Intermediate Pairs of the Southland Secondary School Indoor Bowls Championships.

Our senior class has been working on a project where they are designing and making marble runs using Lego and some cardboard ramps. They can see the correlation between the steepness of the ramp and the distance that the marble will roll. They trial and test and try again. This fits with STEAM education. "It is an educational approach to learning that uses Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics as access points for guiding student inquiry, dialogue and critical thinking. The end results are students who take thoughtful risks, engage in experiential learning, persist in problem-solving, embrace collaboration and work through the creative process.
