SOCIAL SKILLS

Within the context of Thinking, we are currently focusing on Confidence as a social skill at school.

Confidence is closely aligned with selfesteem, perseverance and growth mind-set.



High levels of confidence have been linked to better academic performance and social skills. We need to foster confidence in children by using lots of specific praise and encouragement. Just telling our children, "well done" or "great job" doesn't build self-confidence; it's the specific feedback to children that makes the difference. We certainly don't want to over-do praise as it won't feel sincere to children. Building your child's confidence is one of the most important things you can do as a parent. Here are some ways that you can help grow your child's confidence:

- Encourage their interests Let your child embark on an activity that THEY want to do. Provide opportunities to do this.
- Demonstrate respect don't let your child hear you judging others – it makes your child wary of trying something new.
- Be involved knowing parents are involved is powerful – your time and attention is valuable.
- Step back Let your child show what they can do.
 Too much support to help a child accomplish a task, makes your child dependent on you.
- Comment on effort not results.
