Magic Milk – James McFaul

1. Get a dish, milk and drop coloured food colouring which is blue, red, yellow and green.
2. Pour the milk into the dish and put two drops of food colouring into the milk.

When you put the dishwashing liquid in the milk it will move the colours to the side. There is a hole in the milk that you can see through. The colours will keep moving.

Hypothesis

I think the dishwashing liquid was trying to get the food colouring free of the milk. The milk does not like the soap and the food colouring moves around.

Magic Milk – Cameron Renshaw

What happens when milk and dishwashing liquid mix?

You need:

- Milk
- Petrie dish
- Eye dropper
- Food colouring
- Dishwashing liquid

1. Pour the milk in the petrie dish
2. Put in 2 drops of each food colouring.
3. Put a drop of dishwashing liquid in the milk
4. Observe the reaction.



What happened?

The milk started to swirl and change colour and all the food colouring moved around.
