Our school is lucky enough to have a beehive thanks to the committment to this project by Miss Cahill and her class. We have had Pat Hoffman, from Environment Southland at school teaching the children and staff about the bees. They are just fascinating to watch them working away on the honeycomb. We were able to see them at work and also see the Queen in amongst the worker bees and drones because they were on a frame of honeycomb in a glass case. Pat reported that our bees are healthy and on track to make us lots of lovely honey. This is 'action learning' where the children are learning through real experiences and they are very engaged in what they are learning about. It was timely that Country Calendar was about bees a couple of weeks ago also.

On Thursday Team Whero and Team Papura are visiting the Science Fair to learn how the projects are done and get ideas and motivation to take part in this competition next year. This will be a project that they write up and present at school, but parents could help them look out for ideas to investigate. There might be something on the farm that they want to look into.

The Year 7 & 8 Zone day at Rimu School was a great success. The morning started off with some very active Māori games including Uru and Ki o Rahi. Our students went with a positive attitude and lead some games at the start of the day. They were very inclusive of others and worked well in any team that they were put in. We will be hosting the next Year 7 & 8 Zone day at Tokanui in Term 4.

The Kapa Haka and Choir will be doing a presentation on Monday afternoon. This will be an opportunity for the rest of the school to see them perform and any parents that missed Polyfest are welcome to come along also.

A key component of our Curriculum that is important for setting our children up for success in the future is the Key Competencies. These are: Thinking; which is about using creative, critical and reflective processes to make sense of information. Using language; symbols and texts which is about the symbols that are for communicating information which includes selfmotivation and a "can-do" attitude (students who manage themselves are enterprising, resourceful, reliable, and resilient); Relating to others is about interacting effectively with a diverse range of people in a variety of contexts, and the last KC is participating and contributing which involves being actively involved in Communities including family, school and other groups that they belong to. When the Seniors took part in the Year 8 day at Rimu they were practicing and learning using all of the Key Competencies. Team Karaka have had a very exciting time completing their Media Mash movies and they have had to use all of the Key Competencies to achieve a final product suitable to send off to the competition. The Junior classroom is a very good place to develop the Self-managing skills. New Entrants have their first real experience of organising themselves for the day once they reach school and it is so good to see how capable they are at managing their time and working through their tasks for the day. They can use a QR code to download a story to read along with on the iPad, they take a photo with the iPad and put their learning onto SeeSaw so that the teacher can see it and send some home for caregivers to see and they write the name of their buddy reading book into their reading log to show that they have completed this task.
