It is almost school holiday time and I expect the children will be looking forward to helping on the farm over the next couple of weeks.

Our senior children continue to visit the Playcentre once a week in two's to work with the pre-schoolers and get to know those young people that will be a part of our school over the next couple of years. This is a valuable relationship that we have with our local early childhood centre. Today they had some eggs in an incubator hatching and also a visit from the McCabe's hen and her chickens. We were lucky to also get a visit from the hen and her babies. The children love meeting family pets.

At a time when we are looking at educational reforms we have had Pasi Sahlberg talking at a presentation in Auckland. Pasi is a Professor of Education Policy at the University of New South Wales and a national of Finland which came through a major reform that lead to it being recognised as a world leading education system.

"Finland's education reforms are based on the principles of equity and wellbeing. Every child has equal access to a free public education delivered by highly qualified teachers at local public schools. Play based learning is delivered through compulsory free preschool education so that all children have an equal chance of being ready for formal school learning which starts at age seven. Children are in class for fewer hours than in most other countries and are encouraged to engage in sport and play activities outside of their formal school learning time. Schools are funded for equity and special education is generously resourced. This system moved away from competition, testing and publicising results, to an emphasis on Equity and wellbeing; ensuring that the system is inclusive." NZ Principals magazine.
