Happening in Our School...

TEACHING AND LEARNING for Term 4

Swimming lessons with Easyswim begin on the first day of term 4 and will be held each Monday throughout the term. Swim caps and goggles are a great idea. We expect ALL children to swim EVERY week - no excuses - either a written note or verbal contact with the class teacher is expected for all non-swimmers. In term 4 classes will be rounding off their term 3 technology inquiries. Kahurangi students have been investigating how to reduce plastic, Kowhai students are inventing ways to encourage people to put their litter into rubbish bins and Whero students have completed several mini-challenges, such as making their own Healthy Heroes costumes.

In term 4 our emphasis will be on building Oral Language skills through opportunities such as public speaking, puppet plays, assembly presentations and interviewing people.

Our end of year school trip will be a visit to Wellington Zoo, a very popular request from our students.
