# KiVa Review

At the end of Term 2, the KiVa team completed a review of the effect of this programme on our students, teachers and whanau.

### Here's some interesting information to share: -

- There were 32 cases 13% of all our students.
- The "Bullies" involved were made up of 32 boys and 7 girls.
- The children felt strongly that the KiVa team had supported them and it was a fair process.
- 50 % of the bullying had stopped completely after discussion with the KiVa team. After further follow up, 98% of the cases had stopped. To date, only 1 case has been sent further to the Principal.
- Victims were a group of 19 boys and 8 girls.
- Teachers had noticed a positive difference to behaviour in the playground and classroom. Teachers were finding the KiVa programme was definitely helping the children be aware of what bullying is, ways to stop bullying and roles they can play in bullying situations.

The KiVa team is looking to complete another review at the end of the term. We will look forward to sharing this information with our community.
