SCOOTER SAFETY

Could you please continue to talk to your children about road safety. We received another phone call last week from a concerned motorist who had to brake severely to miss one of our students who scooted out in front of their car.

IMMUNISATION REGISTER

All schools pay an important role in protecting the health and wellbeing of children in their care.

The Health (Immunisation) Regulations 1995 require all primary schools to keep an immunisation register. Knowing a child's immunisation history is very important for schools as diseases can easily spread where children spend time close together.

Non-immunised children are more at risk and may become seriously ill. Immunisation information is confidential. A parent/caregiver can access the information on the register about their child only.

In the case of an outbreak, the school and the PHS have the authority to request a child stay at home. PHS staff may contact parent/caregivers of unimmunised children and ask that they be kept away until the infectious period has passed and recommend immunisation to protect the child to prevent the spread of the infection.

We will be sending letters home next week to parents who we have received no proof of immunisation from. Could you please request this information from your doctor/ medical centre and ask them to give you a copy or email the information to the school.

SICK CHILDREN

We have had a higher rate of children away sick over the past few weeks and we would like to remind parents to keep children home if they have a high temperature or feeling unwell. It would also be helpful to reinforce good handwashing practises with your children to stop the spread of infections.

WINTER SPORTS

Most winter sports have now finished and by the looks of all the trophies that have been arriving at school, our children have performed very well. The trophies are displayed in the school foyer and you are most welcome to come in and take a photo with your child if they were in the winning team. Also sports coaches are more than welcome to send in a report for their team for the next newsletter.
