Dear Bayview Families,

We are now ¾ of the way through the year but are gearing up for the busiest term ahead. We will endeavour to keep you up to date with event dates so please keep checking our facebook page and our website for this information.

One of the big events we have planned for term 4 is a child led conference open day. This is a day when you can come and see what happens in your childs class. You do not need to make an appointment as any discussions you have about your childs progress and learning will be with your child. We are holding this day on Wednesday 21st November. We have held this day for a few years now and it has proven to be very successful.

If you recall after the last feedback meetings we asked for your feedback around the process and the report design. We received 165 parent responses. This is the highest number of responses we have ever received from parents! Your feedback showed us that:

93.2% of parents found the hauora section of the report informative.

86.6% of parents found the academic progress section of the report informative.

95.2% of parents found the student voice section informative.

90.9% of parents found the feedback meetings informative.

67.7% of parents found the expected level section easy to understand (the little graph).

90.2% of parents would prefer to have feedback meetings after they have received the mid year report.

Some of the comments we received included: I loved the focus on dispositions coming through in the report. I love that such value is put on these dispositions and not just on academic competence.

I like that it is easy to see the expected level and where your child is sitting within these levels. I value the student voice as it gives a good suggestion of how the child feels about their school life.

I really liked the simplicity of the reports. I am just as concerned about the effort as I am about achievement (if not more so), so I appreciate that. I liked the feedback from my son, as well as the teacher feedback. I loved that it was all on one side. Complex, lengthy reports aren't really necessary for either party. I just like knowing if my son is working hard and being kind.

A key to decipher the learning chart would be an excellent addition to the report.

Thank you for all your feedback, it will help us move forward with determining how we report to you in the future.

At Bayview School we put the children's needs first. Every decision we make has the children at the centre. We want our Bayview School kids to leave us knowing they can make a difference in the world and with a set of skills that will help them. We want our kids to have a high emotional intelligence so that they can deal with what life throws at them. I hope you got the chance to watch Nigel Latta's 'Curious Mind' on TVNZ. It had some very important messages about what is important for children to develop healthy and happy members of society. I strongly suggest that if you missed this that you watch it 'on demand'. I was very happy to be affirmed on how important mindfulness is in helping students develop high emotional intelligence and resilience. This is an important part of our programmes.

You will be aware that all our fundraising for the past 2 years has been for a new adventure playground. Our big adventure was built in 1979 when the school was first built. It was a collaboration between the then Education Department and the North Shore City Council. Together a team of parents and council workers built the playground and it was the only one in Bayview for some time. Over the past 12 years we have had to fix and replace a number of pieces of equipment as they have worn out. This year we have noticed that the bark area has become sodden with all the rain and needs an upgrade. It is time for a NEW playground!

We wanted the children to be the main drivers of this so they have visited playgrounds around Auckland and presented to the Board of Trustees their preferred playground equipment. A group of dedicated teachers and children have met regularly to come up with a concept design. This group have met with a playground specialist who is currently creating a design and a costing to have this built. We intend to apply for grants to support the fundraising we have done as a community and approaching some companies to ask for sponsorship. Together we can do this and provide an awesome community asset!
