These inquiries are known as 'The Exhibition' and provide students with the opportunity to drive their own learning. Part of the requirement of the International Baccalaureate is to take positive action. We were impressed with this effective way to raise awareness. Discrimination, Peer Pressure and Device Addiction were some of the issues the groups presented through slides, questionnaires, quizzes and role plays.
