

This newsletter contains all the information you need about Pet Day, which is happening Friday,

9th November (Postponement Monday the 12th November). Each child is going to be entering one pet or special collection / toy for the event. For our crafts section this year the children will choose to enter one of the 6 categories, please see attached sheet regarding this. Buses will run at normal times. Please advise the office if your child is off the bus.

All pets to be at school by 10.30am.

To make this event a success we will need parent helpers. Please indicate on the following page what you are able to help with.

Order of events: These times are approximate

9 am - 10.30am

Craft making (Please note: Children to bring all required materials from home)

Students will have picked their arts and crafts activity they want to enter and should have all required materials needed unless stated.

10.30am - Morning tea - Judges arrive and briefed on judging procedure.

10.30am-11am – Pets arrive and students to get organised for judging.

11am - Judging of Pets and crafts. Students need to be with their pet at this stage with their pet diary.

- Best presented lamb
- Best presented dog Must be well handled and safe around children and be controlled at all times.
- Best presented pony
- Open Section best presented for any other animal other than the above.
- Best presented soft toy or collection You may like to dress your toy up or make a costume for it.

Please note that there is no calf entries this year.

Children must be available to explain how they look after their animal or to talk about what is special about their toy or collection.

11.30am - Competition Time

- Lamb drinking competition Lamb and owner run a short distance with a bottle of milk across the finish line. The winner will be the first to finish their milk. No lead or ropes.

- Best Trick All students who want to enter their pet must do so before pet day. On the day students will be asked to show the judge their pet's trick
- Pet Human look alike competition. Held at Lunchtime You and your pet dress the same e.g. as Santa – both wear Santa hats.

12pm – BBQ / Family Picnic Lunch – Sausages will be available to buy and hot drinks available to purchase

1pm – Agri Kids (Yr3-6) We are looking for parent helpers who are able to oversee a 10 minute activity with a group of children. These activities involve practical farm based challenges that will be all organised for you to run on the day. Please let us know if you can help us out.

Lumsden School's Pet Day Craft Activities 2018

This year we have made changes to our Pet Day craft activities to reflect our children's interests. There are 6 different activities for the children to choose from which they will construct on the morning of Pet Day here at school. Please help your child to choose from one of the options below and return to school so we can be organised with resources and space to create. Please tick the box that your child would like to do and if you have more than one child please write all their names beside the activity they would like to do on this sheet.

<u>Design a t-shirt</u> : Animal theme – Children need to bring along an old t-shirt to decorate / modify. There will be felts and paint for children to use but you will need to bring along any other supplies that you might want to use e.g. buttons, fabric, feathers etc
<u>Design a pet rock</u> – Children will need to bring along a large stone / small rock to decorate. Paint will be available for children to use and some wobbly eyes. You will need to bring along any other supplies that you might want to use e.g. buttons, fabric feathers etc
<u>Recycled Creation</u> : Animal theme – Children will create an animal out of recycled materials that they have collected e.g. plastic bottles, milk bottle tops, cans, material etc.
<u>Decorated Mask</u> : Animal theme – Children will decorate a mask which reflects an animal of their choice. There will be felts and paint for children to use but you will need to bring along any other supplies that you might want to use.
<u>Decorated biscuit collection:</u> Animal theme – Children will be given 5 plain biscuits to decorate, coloured icing will be provided but children will need to bring along anything else they want to use to decorate their biscuits.
<u>Farm Invention:</u> Children will create a simple invention that could be used on the farm. This could be a drawing and a model or you might like to make it out of materials you find at home. The model can be worked on at home but <u>needs to be assembled at school</u> on the morning of Pet Day.
