Happening in Our School...

Māori Hui @ Rewa Rewa School

A group has been meeting to discuss ways of developing our school's kaupapa and building connections within our community. We need YOU to be involved. So, no matter what nationality you are, we will be inviting you to attend a hui this term to share what matters to you and to listen to the ideas that others contribute. A flier will be sent home shortly with details - everyone will be welcome, including grandparents and whānau.

Curriculum Term 4

This term our focus will be to develop the Oral Language skills of our learners through fun activities such as plays, active learning sessions, speech writing, collaborative play-based learning and performing in front of an audience. A theatre group will be performing at our school later in the term and senior students will participate in a prepared speech competition at NIS.

The end of term outing for the whole school will be a trip to Wellington Zoo on Wednesday 12 December, as we explore our Wellington community. Keep this date in your calendar, as we'll need parent help.

It is very important to gauge how our students feel about themselves as learners and what they are

interested in learning about. This term we have used several ways of gathering this information including the NZCER online WellBeing survey, ALiM maths and writing questionnaires. We will be using this information to inform our 2019 programmes of learning.

Swimming

Easyswim swimming lessons for our school this term are on every Monday. Swimming lessons are heavily subsidised by Easyswim and Kiwisport, so our families are very fortunate to have this financial support. Please pack your child's togs and towel each week so that they can get the most out of this programme. The pool may also be used for recreational swimming during the week, but individual class teachers will notify you of these times.

We would recommend that families continue with lessons out-of-school. When swimming at Tawa Pool last term we noticed that our year 3–4 students, in particular, have a long way to go to before they could be called competent swimmers. We must do our best to keep those drowning statistics in NZ down!

Athletics

Athletics trials are underway for yr 4–6 athletes. Successful students will be competing at the Northern Zone competition on Monday 29 October.

Parent Noticeboard - Volunteers



Enrolment Scheme

The first ballot for term 1, 2019 will be advertised in next week's Independent Herald (Wednesday 31 October). month later on 30 November. If you live out-of-zone and have a child who will be starting with us in term 1 you must complete and return your enrolment form within this timeframe or your child will have to wait until term 2 to start at school.

We only have up to 29 places open for the year, including places for in-zone enrolments. In-zone enrolments can be accepted anytime, but we need to know if your child is coming so that we can make good decisions about how many out-of-zone placements to

students, as this will allow us to keep our unique character of a small school with a large heart.
