REPORTING AND ASSESSMENT

The children have been completing mid-year assessments and staff been expected to interpret and analyse this data on an individual and class basis in preparation for the writing of the interim reports.

Whilst there was no definitive issues from our community consultation regards reporting, the staff have been mindful that the Key Competencies section has not been consistent from mid to end of year. National standards have also needed to be changed to Curriculum Levels. We have sort to rectify this situation and reviewed the report form accordingly. Next week I will expand on the changes in more detail.

The interim year reports will be sent to parents/whanau on FRIDAY 29th of July. They will be followed by interviews on Monday 2nd, Tuesday 3rd, Wednesday 4th of July. These are very important interviews for teachers/parents and children (if you wish). They can often further encourage our amazing learners and/or set new directions of learning. We have a very high turn out to these interviews. I encourage you to mark these dates on your calendar now.

Interview booking slips will be sent out next week and the finalised times will be in the envelope with your child's report on the 29th of July.

THE WOOLSHED

This weekend we return to Ordinary time. This Sunday is the 10th Sunday in Ordinary time. Ordinary time is represented by the colour green.


